

AVOIDING ELECTRICAL HAZARDS *DURING AND AFTER A FLOOD*

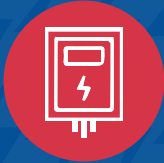
01 AVOID FLOODED ROOMS
where water could be in contact with electrical outlets or appliances.



03 NEVER TOUCH OR USE
an electrical appliance when wet.



02 DO NOT ATTEMPT
to turn off the power from your breaker box if it requires standing in water.



04 KEEP ELECTRICAL TOOLS
at least ten feet from wet areas.

Usually, vegetation helps absorb rainwater. After a wildfire, burned vegetation and soil form a water repellent layer, blocking water absorption.

When it rains on the burn scar, the rain water isn't absorbed and bounces off the soil.

Properties located downstream from the burn areas are at an increased risk of flooding.

Even on clear days, properties upstream are at risk for extended outages caused by flood damage.
